To our new residents who have joined Westwood Fraser Rise since our last newsletter – Welcome to our community!

As we welcome spring in Westwood, it's exciting to see plenty of growth and development across both Westwood Walk and Westwood Place.

Driving through the Westwood Walk precinct, you would have noticed that the north section of the **Linear Reserve / The Walk** is complete. Residents can now walk or ride along this reserve while enjoying the popular parks along the way. At the same time, work is progressing smoothly on the southern end of the linear reserve, which is on track for completion by the end of the year.

On completion of these landscape works, our community will be connected along the Linear Reserve, Westwood Park, Infinity Park and Wetland reserve. This provides a key link between neighbourhoods and allows residents to meet and greet each other while enjoying the landscaped spaces.

In other news, we are thrilled about the progress of the **Community Activity Centre** being constructed by the City of Melton. It is now anticipated to be completed by early 2025. Designed to meet the needs of Westwood and the surrounding neighbourhoods' rapidly expanding population, this facility will serve as a hub for community events, programs and services, enriching life at Westwood. Additionally, the centre will include a kindergarten and maternal and child health facilities, providing significant value to families.

The **Plumpton Aquatic Centre** is also one step closer to reality. Since our last update, the building masterplan has now been approved with construction planned to start in late 2025 with expected opening in 2028. Located along Beattys Road and within walking distance from Westwood, this amenity will keep our residents active with the many pools and facilities planned.

In terms of the construction activity at Westwood Walk, **Stage 18** has now achieved Statement of Compliance (SOC) and many of our future residents are in the process of preparing to settle while selecting their builder and home designs – how exciting! Westwood Place is also full of momentum, with the construction of Stage 2B now reaching practical completion and Stage 3 progressing well. Stage 4 construction works are projected to start in the next 2 months and titles are expected in Q4 2025.

The major intersection works on Tarleton Road are also progressing, which is our key connection into the southern part of Westwood Place, where you will find our future major park central to the precinct. The park plans are at concept phase and with Council for initial review.

For Westwood Place, we have also recently hosted a Meet your Neighbour event to welcome new residents and for them to get to know each other. The event was a success with new friendships made and the expanding of the Fraser Rise community.

In closing, as the weather gets warmer in the coming months, we look forward to Westwood residents getting out and about to enjoy the blooming landscapes and nature spaces in Westwood Walk. Thank you for being part of the Westwood community and we hope to see you and your family at our upcoming events.

Construction works at Westwood are at full steam ahead, with Stage 2B now fast approaching titles! We are delighted to welcome new residents to become part of our vibrant Westwood Community. 

Masterplan Approved for the Plumpton

We're pleased to provide residents with an update on the future Plumpton Aquatic and Leisure Centre (PALC), which will be located on Beattys Road, walking distance to Westwood Walk.

The building's masterplan was approved at Council's July 22 meeting. Community consultation in May provided feedback on the Centre's design themes, the importance of individual services and facilities, and

More than 1,000 responses were received and the additional features that were approved include:

- · A multipurpose/events space and rooftop deck
- An additional second program pool for learn to swim and aqua aerobics
- Refinement of the aquatic sensory space layout
- Relocation of the gym to the ground floor and group fitness to the first floor
- Increased car parking

This is in addition to an indoor pool, splash play areas and water slides, spa, sauna, allied health spaces, an outdoor interactive water play area with beach-style access, change facilities and a café.

Construction is slated to start in late 2025 and the centre is expected to open in early 2028.

Community Update on the Future Plumpton Children's Centre & Neighbourhood House

The Plumpton Children's Centre and Neighbourhood House will be constructed at 19 Pear Parade, on the north-eastern corner of the Westwood Walk precinct.

The \$15-million centre will provide vital services and programs for the rapidly growing Fraser Rise community, including the provision of early years, family and community services.

This is a response by Council to the significant demand identified for kindergarten places and the need for a new facility in the Fraser Rise area, to accommodate both projected population growth and the rollout of three-year old kindergarten, which commenced in the City of Melton in 2022.

The new building is expected to be completed in early 2025 and will include Kindergarten and community meeting rooms, maternal and

child health spaces, outdoor licensed play space, community spaces and will be fully furnished.

As one of the fastest growing communities in Melton, this is an essential addition for the Westwood community, and it's wonderful to have it so conveniently close to our residents. We look forward to seeing the centre take shape.
